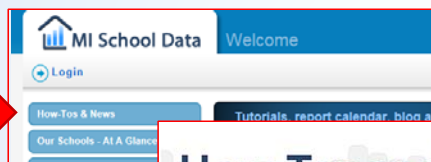

- Additional K-12 Data Files (those data files formerly on the CEPI homepage)





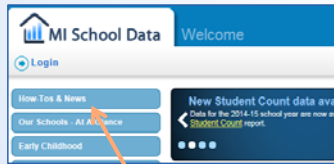
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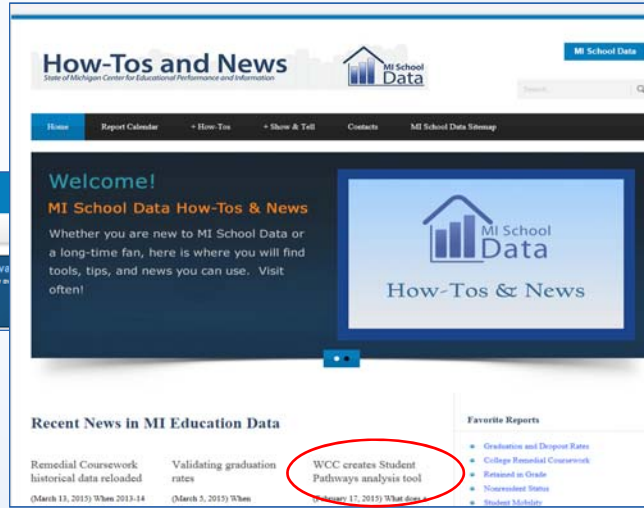
WCC Pathways Analysis Tool

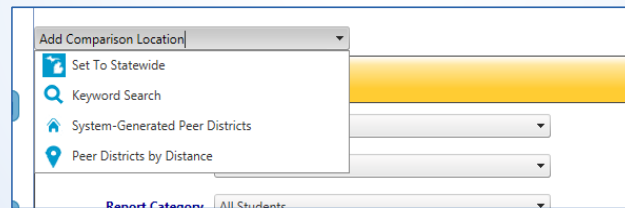
[Average Industry Wage by Education Level](#)

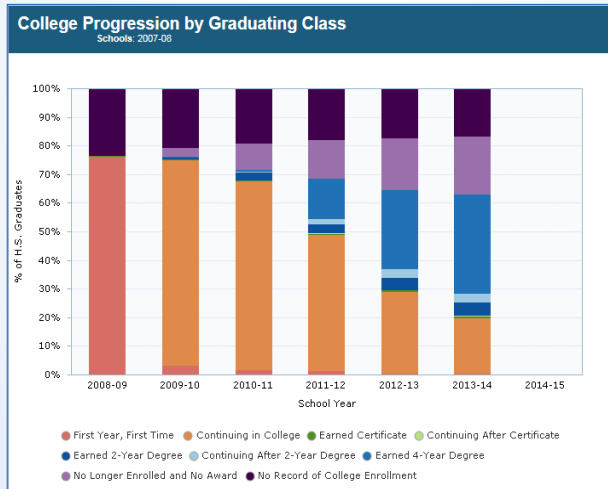
Upcoming Reports/New Functionality
